Tabor to Francis Kahn and the other conveyed by Alexander M. Beets to Francis Kahn. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining and all the estate, right, title, claim and interest whatsoever in the said Franz Kahn and of the parties to the cause aforesaid and of each of them in and to the same and of all other persons rightfully claiming from under or by them or either of them to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said John W. Modification of Lease

To J modification of Lease
W. A. Moore

This Contract made this day between W. A. Moore Lessor and The Greenville Savings Bank Lessee witnesseth: That the old lease contract made by them on the 1st day of September 1888 shall remain in full force and effect excepting the following changes.

The said Lessor agrees for the Lessee to sub-let his building on Washington Street on the following conditions: to which the Lessee agrees viz: The said Lessor is to receive, in addition to the yearly rental of \$200⁰⁰, the sum of twenty five dollars per annum for the privilege of subletting the rooms. Which sum of \$25⁰⁰ a year the Lessee agrees to pay. And it is hereby agreed that the Lessee shall not sub-let the rooms for liquor-selling purposes, for a butcher business or for any business which will increase the rate of insurance on the same. It is agreed also that the Lessee shall pay all expenses for any alterations in the arrangement of said building and to surrender the same to the Lessor upon the expiration of the lease on the first day of September 1893 in good order and condition.
