City of Greenville, in the state aforesaid, am indebted to various persons, and whereas I'm desirous of paying the same as far as I am able to do so, without prejudice;

Now therefore to wit my true intents, that I do and in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars to me in hand paid by Henry C. Bardin of the City and State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and delivered, and by these presents, do grant, bargain, sell and deliver unto the said Henry C. Bardin, all of my stock of goods, wares, merchandise, Caudis and Perfumeries now in the store on Main Street, in said City, comprised by me, consisting principally of Caudis and fruits, and also all stone furniture and fixtures therein contained, and belonging to me; also all of my right title and interest in and to one Soda Fountain and apparatus, One National Cash Register, and One New Nat. Roaster, (the said Soda Fountain and apparatus, Cash Register and New Nat. Roaster are mortgaged for a portion of the purchase money of such, and this assignment is made subject to said mortgage,) also all of my other property of whatever kind excepted as is under the law exempt from levy and sale.
