Whereas Thomas B. Cunningham Jasper E. Watson Willie W. Benson John J. Watson Jasper E. Cunningham and John J. Benson did on the thirteenth day of March 1891 file with the Secretary of State a written declaration signed by themselves setting forth:
First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be Thomas B. Cunningham Jasper E. Watson Willie W. Benson John J. Watson Jasper E. Cunningham and John J. Benson all reside at or near Travellers Rest in Greenville County South Carolina
Second: The name of the proposed Corporation to be that of "Home Standard Fertilizer and Impurement Company" that the principal purpose of the

purpose of the Corporation is to be Travellers Rest Greenville County S. C. that the general purpose of the Corporation and the nature of the business which it purports to do is to manufacture and to sell fertilizers to buy improve and sell Real Estate to purchase and operate planning and other wood working machinery and deal in dressed and improved lumber

Third: The amount of Capital stock to be Fifteen thousand Dollars and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be One hundred and fifty of the par value of One hundred dollars each

And Whereas on the thirteenth day of March 1891 the said John J. Watson Thomas B. Cunningham Jasper E. Watson and W. W. Benson were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators authorizing and empowering them to open books of subscription to the Capital stock of said proposed Corporation giving not less than one day previous notice by advertisement in a newspaper published in the County of Greenville giving notice of the time and place where said book of subscription would be opened.

And Whereas the said Board of Corporators on the first day of June A. D. 1891 did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing over their signatures certifying among other things that all the Capital stock has been subscribed that nine thousand Dollars thereof was paid in and the balance secured to be paid that the following directors have been elected J. J. Watson T. B. Cunningham W. W. Benson J. E. Watson J. J. Benson and J. E. Cunningham that the following officers have been elected T. B. Cunningham President and J. E. Watson Secretary and Treasurer

Now therefore I J. E. Tridall Secretary of State by virtue of the authority in me vested by an Act of the General Assembly entitled An Act to Provide for the Formation of Certain Corporations under General Laws approved the twenty third day December 1886 and all Acts amendatory thereto do hereby certify that said Company has been fully organized according to the Laws of South Carolina under the name and for the purposes recited in the within Declaration
