 term of one year dating from January 1st 1893 to January
 1st 1894, for which, the party of the first part, is to re-
 ceive a royalty on all goods sold by the said party
 of the second part of Five (\$5.00) Dollars per gross for
 large size bottles of Tonic, and Two 75¢/100 (\$2.50)
 Dollars per gross for small size bottles of Tonic, a
 statement of such sales by party of second part
 to be rendered to the party of the first part monthly
 by on the tenth of each month for such sales as have
 been made during previous months, and settlements
 for royalty due on such sales to be made quarterly in
 cash and the books of the Company showing re-
 cords of sales of Dr. Westwoodland Tonic" to be open
 at all times for inspection by the said party of
 the first part, should be so done. It is further un-
 derstood that the tonic or material in question is
 to be manufactured by Messrs W. H. Wampole
 and Company of Philadelphia Penna, and return
 the Truck Mfg Co, as to function in bulk
 such quantities and at such prices as they arrange
 for with the said W. H. Wampole & Co. It is also
 understood that the party of the second part has no
 control in the manufacture of the tonic before
