

The State of South Carolina
Greenville County:

Whereas E. W. Kendrick, am the owner in
 full right of a tract of land situated lying
 and being in Greenville County and State of
 said, adjoining the lands of the P. R. Rains, &
 J. T. Pughan, by said land having the following
 lines more or less bounded to wit, beginning at a white
 oak 3x5m running thence S 66 3/4° E 8.85 Ch. crossing Bell-
 ger creek branch water of Enoree River to a Post oak
 (dead) 8x0m, thence S 67 1/2° E 240 Ch, to a stone 3x1.5m, thence
 N 43.10.10 Ch, to a line 3x0m, thence S 82 10.7.40 Ch crossing
 said creek, to a oak (dead), 3x5m thence S 70.9.70 Ch
 to stone 3x0m, thence S 80 1/2° W. 3.30 Ch to stone 3x0m.
 thence S 62° E 16.65 Ch to the beginning of a stream, containing there
 some more or less, & bounded on the north by
 lands of C. R. Rains, on the east by lands of J. T. Pughan,
 and on the south & west by lands of said P. Rains.
 And whereas the Pelham Mills now has, and its pre-
 cessor for many years past have had and maintained
 a dam across Enoree River, whereby the water of
 said River have been, and are now utilized for
 manufacturing purposes the present perpendicular
 height of said dam being four ten feet two in-
 ches & three fourths of an inch measured to the top
 of the coping stone on said dam from a flitch
 or groove cut in a square of eight inches with
 cope line running from corner to corner, which
 is cut in the Pelham rock at the base of
 said dam near the side of the third flood gate
 from the south side; And whereas the said the
 Pelham Mills is desirous of increasing the
 height of the aforesaid dam four feet additional,
 so that the height thereof shall be eighteen feet,
 two inches, and three fourths of an inch, or such
 less height as may seem best; And whereas such increase
 in the height of said dam may back the water
 of said Enoree River, or of its affluents, upon and
 overflow my said above described land, and
 cause damage to the same or to the crops which
 may from time to time be planted and grown thereon;
