Now, I, now all my life, by these presents, shall I Elizabeth E. Cosby, of the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina, in the free and voluntary exercise of the powers given to me by the deed of Hewlett Sullivan deceased, being conscious of the fact that in all probability I will never have any heir of my body, for and in consideration of the sum of one dollar, to me in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and for the further good consideration of the natural regard and affection which I have and bear unto my husband, Thomas L. Cosby, of the state and County aforesaid, do nominate, ~~and~~ constitute and elect or appoint, and by these presents have nominated, constituted and elected or appointed without power of revocation the said Thomas L. Cosby, my heir to succeed to all the property, embraced in the said deed of Hewlett Sullivan to J.P. & J.N. Latimer as my trustees, also all property which has been or may hereafter be substituted therefor, whatever its form, also all property of which I may be possessed, to have and to hold all and singular the said property, including the substituted property after the determination of the life estate therein, conveyed, in trust for me unto the said Thomas L. Cosby, his heirs and assigns as fully as I am empowered in and by said deed executed by Hewlett Sullivan to J.P. & J.N. Latimer as trustees for me.

In testimony, whereof I do hereinunto set my hand and seal on this 14<sup>th</sup> day of September Eighteen hundred and ninety three, and in the one hundred and seventeenth year of the sovereign independence of the United States of America.
