Townes, a resident of the City of Greenville in the County
 and State aforesaid S. Brook Townes of the City of Atlanta
 in the County of Fulton and State of Georgia, have
 filed with the Clerk of the Court for the said County of
 Greenville, their written declaration, signed by themselves,
 setting forth: 1. Their names and places of residence
 and stating their desire to form themselves into an ed-
 ucational Corporation, 2. That the name of the proposed
 Corporation is to be "Greenville College for Women," and
 is to be located in the aforesaid City of Greenville and
 County of Greenville and State of South Carolina,
 occupying for the present the dwelling premises of
 said A. S. Townes and the buildings and lot adjoining,
 known as the Conservatory of Music, both on Col-
 lege Street in the said City of Greenville with said
 A. S. Townes as President, and that the general
 purposes of said Corporation are: To maintain
 an Institution of Learning for the higher edu-
 cation of young women; to make said College
 in all respects a first class Institution, equal to any
 of its kind in the State. 3. That said College is to have
 power to confer all academic degrees honors such
 as are usually enjoyed by like chartered Institutions
 learning. 4. That the College may have a Board
 of Trustees, or of Visitors, with the honorary power
 usually enjoyed by such Boards. 5. That the said
 incorporators may add to their number from
 time to time as may seem best to them, and that
 that said College should have all the rights, im-
 munities, privileges, etc. granted to all chartered
 Colleges under the Statutes of South Carolina; and
 praying that a Certificate of incorporation be granted
 to them: Now, therefore, I, William D. Koetts, Clerk
 of the said Court do hereby certify that the said
 Alexander S. Townes and S. Brooks Townes have
 been, have been, and by these presents are incor-
 porated for the purposes set forth in said declaration
 under the name of Greenville College for young
 Women, with power: 1. to make by-laws not
 inconsistent with the laws of this State or the United
 States. 2. To have and use a Common Seal
