 State a written Declaration signed by
 themselves setting forth First The names
 and residences of the said petitioners to be as
 above. Second The name of the proposed
 Corporation to be that of The South Carolina
 Seed Oil and Fertilizer Company. The
 principal place of business shall be South
 Carolina. The general purpose of the Corpora-
 tion and the nature of business it proposes
 to do is to manufacture Cotton Seed Oil
 meal, Fertilizer &c.

Third The amount of
 Capital Stock to be Seven Thousand Dollars,
 and the number of Shares into which the
 same is to be divided to be Two hundred
 and Fifty of the par value, Fifty Dollars
 each.

And Whereas on the 3rd day of July 1896
 the said above named petitioners were
 commissioned by me a Board of Corporation
 authorizing and empowering them to open
 books of subscription to the Capital Stock
 of said proposed Corporation, giving not less
 than one days previous notice by adver-
 tisement in the a Newspaper
 published in the County of Pickens, giving
 notice of the time and place where sub-
 scription books should be opened. And
 whereas the said Board of Corporation on
 the 3rd day of September did file with the
 Secretary of State their return in writing
 averring and certifying among other
 things that 20% of the subscribed stock
