 That I the said John F. Hightower of Greenville  
 County and in the State aforesaid for and in  
 consideration of the sum of Ten  $\times$  100 Dollars to me  
 in hand at and before the sealing of these presents  
 by Mary C. Hightower, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged)  
 have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these  
 presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the  
 said Mary C. Hightower, all those separate, pieces, parcel  
 and tracts of land situate, lying, and being in  
 Saluda Township in the county and State aforesaid  
 as hereinafter described to wit: Tract No. 1. Beginning  
 at a stone 370 m. (D. W.) on A. W. Humphreys line.  
 Thence S. 39 3/4 N. 22.24 to pine 370 m. (down) Thence  
 S. 117. E. 45.50 to white oak 370 m. on D. B. Hightower  
 line, thence N. 75.5 E. 21.10 to stone 37 m. on D. B.  
 Hightower's line. Thence N. 17. W. 42.40 across river to poplar  
 370 m. Thence N. 6. W. 11.00 to stone 37 m. Thence N. 30. W.
