CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION.

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA.

By the Secretary of State.

Whereas, Henry Moseley, L. D. Bowman and Henry S. Boulware, all of Greenville, S.C. two or more of the officers or agents appointed to supervise or manage the affairs of The Laborer's Immediate Relief Association an Association which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 26th day of March, A.D. 1903, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or

regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation. That the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for a Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than as above stated, or for the insurance of life, health, accident or property and that three days' notice in the Greenville Daily Herald, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

And Whereas, The said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST. Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND. The name of the proposed Corporation is The Laborer's Immediate Relief Association.

THIRD. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation desires to hold property in common for charitable or eleemosynary purposes, other than for the insurance of life, health, accident or property, the purpose of the corporation being to provide for the nursing and waiting on the sick, and burying the dead members of the Corporation.

FIFTH. The names and residences of all Managers, Trustees, Directors or other officers are as follows: Henry Moseley, President;

L. D. Bowman, Secretary;

Henry S. Boulware, Treas. & Gen'l Manager.

all of Greenville, S.C. -

SIXTH. That they desired to be incorporated in perpetuity.

Now, Therefore, I, M. R. COOPER, Secretary of State, by virtue of authority in me vested, do hereby declare the said organization to be a body politic and corporate, with all the rights, powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the limitations and liabilities conferred by an Act of the General Assembly of South Carolina entitled: "An Act to provide for the Incorporation of Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal or Charitable Churches, Lodges, Societies, Associations or Companies, and for amending the Charters of those already formed and to be formed," approved February 19, A.D., 1900, and other provisions of law.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State, at Columbia, this 26th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred & three and in the one hundred and twenty-seventh year of the Independence of the United States of America.
