Also that tract in Glassy Mountain Township, lying on Jamison's Mill Creek of South Pacolet River, beginning at a stone on the south bank of said creek, and running thence due west to a sourwood; thence about south-west to a stone; thence N. 6. W. to a chestnut; thence N. 42 W. 13.78 chains to a chestnut oak on corner of the F. M. Gosnell land above described; thence with line of said Gosnell land N. 11 1/2 W. to Jamison's Mill Creek; thence down the said Creek to the beginning corner; containing sixty-eight (68) acres, more or less, and being a portion of the tract of land conveyed by the late O. B. Irvine to William Reid, by deed bearing date December 7, 1870, and recorded in said office on May 22, 1871, in Deed Book "C. C. Q." at page 607; and by said William Reid conveyed to Luther R. Fisher, by deed bearing date October 28, 1902, and recorded in said office on December 2, 1902, in Deed Book "J. J. J." at page 116; and conveyed by the said Luther R. Fisher to me, the said R. E. Johnston, by deed bearing date October 1, 1903, and recorded in said office on October 28, 1903, in Deed Book "J. J. J." at page 897;

Also that tract in Glassy Mountain Township on Jamison's Mill Creek of South Pacolet River, beginning at a stone 3x on the north bank of said creek, on the dividing line between the Micajah Campbell lands and the William Reid lands, and running thence up the meanders of the said Jamison's Mill Creek to the mouth of the first branch above the road that leads to David Lockhart's, to a stone 3x at the mouth of said branch thence up the meanders of said branch to a stone 3x; thence up the main leading hollow to a gap in the mountain straight north-east to the original line of the plat, to a stone 3x; thence with said original line S. 78 1/2 E. 4.50 chains to a chestnut oak 3x; thence S. 89 1/2 E. 3.63 ch. to a stake 3x; thence with line of Rev. A. T. Bower's land S. 29 1/2 E. 32.78 ch. to a hickory; thence S. 80 1/2 W. 14.36 ch. to a dead pine and small pine 3x; thence S. 30 1/2 W. 14.50 ch. to the beginning stone on the bank of Jamison's Mill Creek; containing ninety-eight (98) acres, more or less, and being a part of the tract of land conveyed by the said O. B. Irvine to William Reid, by said deed bearing date December 7, 1870, and recorded in said office on May 22, 1871, in Deed Book "C. C. Q." at page 607; and by the said William Reid conveyed to John J. Campbell, by deed bearing date December 15, 1890, and recorded in said office on December 27, 1890, in Deed Book "X. X." at page 309; and by the said John J. Campbell reconveyed to the said William Reid, by deed bearing date October 18, 1897, and recorded in said office on October 28, 1903, in Deed Book "H. H. H." at page 749; and by the said William Reid conveyed to me, the said R. E. Johnston, by deed bearing date October 1, 1903, and recorded in said office on October 28, 1903, in Deed Book "J. J. J." at page 898;

Also that tract in Glassy Mountain Township, on waters of North Saluda River, comprising several separate tracts of land and containing in the aggregate, three hundred and twenty two and two thirds (322 2/3) acres, more or less, a portion of this land is a tract which was conveyed as four hundred and thirty seven (437) acres, by Joshua Lindsey to Charles A. Gosnell, by certain metes and bounds which are fully set forth in a deed executed by the said Joshua Lindsey, bearing date February 5, 1887, and recorded in said office on November 27, 1888, in Deed Book "U. U." at page 534. From this 437 acres tract, the said Charles A. Gosnell, conveyed a certain portion containing two hundred and eighteen (218) acres to Joshua Gosnell, by deed bearing date June 4, 1887, and recorded in said office on November 10, 1903, in Deed Book "L. L. L." at page 21, said deed fully describing said portion conveyed to said Joshua Gosnell;

two hundred and nineteen (219) acres of the said Joshua Lindsey tract. Another portion of this land being a tract which was conveyed to the said Charles A. Gosnell, by the late Lemuel N. Wilcox, by deed bearing date December 4, 1890, and recorded in said office on November 2, 1903, in Deed Book "L. L. L." at page 12; said tract having the following metes and bounds, according to a plat thereof prepared by J. D. Norman, surveyor, which plat was delivered by the said Charles A. Gosnell to me, the said R. E. Johnston, and is herewith delivered; said plat bearing date the first day of February, 1894, to wit:— Beginning at a stake or stone on the old Middleton line, and running thence S. 30 E. 21.50 chains to a hickory; thence S. 40 E. crossing North Saluda River, 37.25 chains to a Chestnut oak in Brushy Hill Gap; thence S. 50. 2/3 W. 27.90 ch. to an old Chestnut stump; thence S. 37. 1/2 E. 11.75 ch. to a poplar; thence S. 63. 1/2 E. 5.72 ch. to a large chestnut; thence N. 87 W. 6. 21 ch. to a stone; thence S. 35 W. 8.00 ch. to a stone; thence N. 45 W. 22. 50 ch. to a hickory; thence N. 14. 1/2 E. 11.50 ch. to a black gum; thence N. 14. 1/2 E. 9.00 ch. to a poplar; thence N. 16 W. 14.00 ch. to a stone; thence N. 14 E. crossing North Saluda River 6.00 ch. to a hickory; thence N. 18 W. 20.00 ch. to a chestnut oak on the old corner of the "Big Survey" and the Middleton land; thence N. 36 E. 10.00 ch. to the beginning corner; containing one hundred and forty five (145) acres, more or less. The remainder of said land is a tract conveyed to the said Charles A. Gosnell by Peter Gosnell, by deed bearing date March 3, 1888, and recorded in said office on November 30, 1888, in Deed Book "U. U." at page 533, wherein said land is described as follows to wit: beginning at a stake on the north side of North Saluda River, on the old line between Peter Gosnell and Chas. A. Gosnell, and running thence nearly north down the branch to said river; thence nearly west over a little bluff to a stake on the branch; thence nearly east to a stake on the C. A. Gosnell, old line, thence nearly south with said line to the beginning stake; containing five (5) acres more or less. The said Charles A. Gosnell thereafter executed to me, the said R. E. Johnston a deed bearing date November 3, 1903, and recorded in said office on November 12, 1903, in Deed Book "L. L. L." at page 26, whereby he conveyed to me the said three tracts of 219 acres, 145 acres and 5 acres, respectively, aggregating 369 acres; whereupon I, the said R. E. Johnston, did thereupon execute a deed, bearing date November 10, 1903, and recorded in said office on November 13, 1903, in Deed Book "L. L. L." at page 31, reconveying to the said Charles A. Gosnell three tracts of the cleared portions of said 369 acre tract, as follows: a tract of 25 acres, a tract of 5 acres, and a tract of 16 1/3 acres, more or less, aggregating 46 1/3 acres, more or less; thus leaving the title to the remaining 322 2/3 acres, more or less, vested in me, the said R. E. Johnston, and intended to be conveyed by the present deed; the descriptions contained in all the various deeds hereinabove mentioned are hereby adopted as a part of the description herein;

Also that tract in Glassy Mountain Township, on waters of North Saluda River, adjoining the tract of land last above described and lands of Wm. H. Irvine et al; containing one hundred and eighteen (118) acres, more or less; this being a portion of the tract hereinbefore mentioned as having been conveyed by Charles A. Gosnell to Joshua Gosnell, by deed bearing date June 4, 1887, and recorded in said office on November 10, 1903, in Deed Book "L. L. L." at page 21, wherein said tract so conveyed is described as containing two hundred and eighteen (218) acres, more or less; said Joshua Gosnell having conveyed one hundred (100) acres of said land to F. R. Morgan by deed bearing date September 7, 1898, and recorded in said office on September 28, 1898, in Deed Book "F. F. F." at page 121; the remaining one hundred and eighteen (118) acres of said land having been conveyed by the said Joshua Gosnell to me, the said R. E. Johnston, by deed bearing date November 10, 1903, and recorded in said office on November 12, 1903, in Deed Book "L. L. L." at page 26;
