

sands, said English shall mail to said Kithil weekly a statement showing the quantities mined and the estimated percentage of pure monazite contained therein. Settlement for said mined sands, at the rate of eight and one half cents per pound of pure monazite, shall then be made in the same manner as hereinbefore provided for bought sands.

SIXTH. Said English guarantees that the percentage of Thoria in the Pure monazite separated from the sands to be delivered to said Kithil under this agreement shall not average less than four per cent.

SEVENTH. Said Kithil agrees that he will forthwith transfer to said English all rights and privileges which he now enjoys by reason of any and all contracts or agreements which he has entered into with J.A. Alexander of Greenville South Carolina, providing for the purchase of monazite by said Alexander on a commission of ten dollars per ton of pure monazite, and with W.E. Willimon of Greenville County South Carolina, providing for the mining of monazite by said Willimon on lands of said Willimon, and on two other properties now controlled by him and the sale of the entire out put of these said properties to said Kithil at eight cents per pound of pure monazite to be delivered to said Kithil on the said properties. So far as possible, said Kithil will transfer to said English the good will of persons in Greenville County South Carolina, with whom he has had dealings. Said English in consideration of said transfers agrees to carry out such contracts or agreements as above specified so far as possible or to make other contracts in substitution therefor, said contracts to be satisfactory to the said Alexander and Willimon.

EIGHTH. This agreement shall remain in full force and effect until January 1st, 1915 and deliveries of sand hereunder shall be for calendar years beginning January 1st 1905.

NINTH. This agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators and assigns of the parties hereto.

CHARTER. 249

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

By the Secretary of State.

Whereas, L.M. Hubbard and Adolf F. Baumann, both of Greenville S.C., did on the tenth day of Nov. 1904 file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth

First: The names and residences of the said petitioners to be as above given.

Second: The name of the proposed corporation be that of Paris Mountain Granite Company.

Third: The principal place of business of the corporation will be Greenville S.C.,

Fourth: The general purpose of the corporation, and the nature of business it proposes to do, buy, acquire, quarry, use, handle, sell and dispose of granite and other stone, and all mineral products as well, and generally exercise all powers which now are as may hereafter be conferred on corporation by law.

Fifth: The amount of the capital stock to be twenty thousand dollars, and the number of shares into which the same is to be divided to be two hundred of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

Sixth: The capital stock to be payable as set forth in the Declaration,

AND WHEREAS, on Nov. 10th 1904, the date above named, petitioners were commissioned by me a Board of Corporators: AND WHEREAS, the said Board of Corporators, on the 7th Dec. 1904, did file with the Secretary of State their return in writing, over their signatures, certifying,

among other things, that pursuant to published notice as required in the commission of the Corporators, the books of subscription to the capital stock of the aforesaid Company were duly opened, and that thereupon exceeding fifty per centum of the capital stock was subscribed by bona fide stockholders;

that thereupon a meeting of stockholders was called, and the aforesaid Company duly organized by the election of a Board of Directors, and other necessary officers.

That, furthermore, they have complied with all the requirements of the Code of Laws of the State of South Carolina, of 1902, and all Acts or parts of Acts amendatory thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, J.T. Gantt, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purpose indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Means Conveyance in each County where such Corporation shall have a business office.
