KNOWN ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, I, J. H. Alewine County of Greenville in the aforesaid State, for and in consideration of one hundred and fifty dollars to me paid by the Paris Mountain Water Company, a corporation organized under the laws of South Carolina and doing business in the State aforesaid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and do hereby grant, bargain and sell unto the said Paris Mountain Water Company, its successors and assigns, a right of way over a tract of land and do also waive all charges for the diverting of waters in Chick-Springs Town-ship, Greenville County and State aforesaid, adjoining lands of C.W. Hawkins, J.W. Walker, M.W. G. [redacted], W.P. Hicks. length of line 1450 feet; width of right of way 30 feet, for the purpose of laying their pipes or conduits, appurtenances and appliances there to, to conduct water with the privilege of entering upon the same and making such excavations, fills and levels as may be requisite and the privilege of laying such pipe or pipes or other conduits, appurtenances and appliance thereto as they may deem necessary, and of making such repairs and laying other pipes or conduits appurtenances and appliances thereto as may from time to time be necessary; such pipes or conduits to be approximately located along the lines recently surveyed by the said Paris Mountain Water Company, to have and to hold such Right of Way and privileges for the purpose aforesaid unto the said Paris Mountain Water Company, its successors and assigns forever. the said Paris Mountain Water Company agrees to pay any future damage caused to crops or personal property due to the use of the workmen or teams in hauling over the property, or the bursting of said pipe the amount of said damage to be fixed by arbitration.

KNOWN ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, John W. Walker in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of one dollar and one house connection water to be furnished at the rate of ten-cents per one thousand gallons dollars to me paid by the Paris Mountain Water Company, a Corporation organized under the laws of South Carolina and doing business in the State aforesaid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged; and do hereby grant, bargain and sell unto the said Paris Mountain Water Company its successors and assigns, a right of way following the public road over my tract of land in Chick-Springs, Town-ship Greenville County and State aforesaid, adjoining lands of Mrs. M.J. Bradley, Thomas Bridges, Charles Hawkins, Willis Hicks and others, for the purpose of laying their pipes or conduits and appliances and appurtenances thereto belonging to conduct water with the privilege of entering upon the same and making such excavations, fills and levels as may be requisite and the privilege of laying such pipe or pipes or other conduits, etc, as they may deem necessary, and also the privilege of access to the said right of way over my land for the hauling of material, etc, and of making such repairs and laying other pipes as may from time to time be necessary, such pipes or conduits to be approximately located along the line recently surveyed by the said Paris Mountain Water Company, to have and to hold such Right of Way and privileges for the purpose aforesaid unto the said Paris Mountain Water Company, its successors and assigns forever. The said Paris Mountain Water Company agrees to pay any future damage caused by breaking or bursting of said pipes, the amount of said damage to be fixed by arbitration.
