(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Josephine B. Norwood all of our interest in that piece of property on the north side of Washington st. in the City of Greenville and State and County aforesaid and being the same place where our Mother Josephine B. Norwood now lives. This is the same property conveyed by Mary R. Norwood to N.L. Lipscomb Trustee, on the 31st day of March 1877 and recorded in Vol. I. I. page 95.

TOGETHER with all and singular the Rights, Members, Hereditments and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, all and singular the said premises before mentioned, unto the said Josephine B. Norwood her Heirs and Assigns forever.

And We do hereby bind ourselves our Heirs, Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular, the said premises unto the said Josephine B. Norwood her

Heirs and Assigns, against us and our Heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
