26.50 Received of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company of South Carolina, Six -- /100 dollar, in consideration of which I have hereby granted unto said Company its successors and assigns, the right, privilege and authority to construct operate and maintain its lines of Telephone and Telegraph including the necessary poles, wires and fixtures upon, over and across the property which I own, or in which I have any interest in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina, and upon and along the roads streets, or highways adjoining the said property, with the right to permit the ~~attachement~~ attachments of the wires of any other company, and the right to trim any trees along said lines so as to keep the wires cleared at lease eighteen inches, to erect and set the necessary guy and brace poles and anchors and to attach thereto and to trees the necessary guy wires and the sum being received in full payment therefor and with the right to place two stubs and anchors on said property.
