NOW, Therefore, Know all Men by these Presents, that I, J. W. GRAY, Master in and for the County of Greenville, aforesaid, in consideration of the performance of the conditions aforesaid, and the payment of Dollars, by the said

conveyed convey the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release, unto the said J. R. Thompson, all that certain tract of land situate in Paris Mountain Township,

County and State aforesaid, known as tract No. 8 on plat of survey of the lands of the Estate of Gabriel Thompson, deceased made by W.A. Hester, Surveyor on the 12th, day of November 1910 containing fifteen and a half acres (15-1/2) more or less and having the following metes and bounds to wit: Beginning on an iron pin on White Horse Road and running; thence N. 70 W. 22.50 to stone; thence S. 37-1/2 E. 1.85 to stake; thence S. 41-3/4 E. 4.00 to stake; thence S. 36-3/4 E. 19.00 to stake in old road; thence N. 27 E. 13.45 to iron pin on White Horse Road, the beginning corner.
