We hereby certify unto all whom it may concern that the lot of land described in the annexed deed from J. R. Tripp, J. R. Watson, H. W. Murff and R. F. Wyatt, parsonage trustees to W. E. Hill, bearing date April 1, 1910, is a portion of the lot of land conveyed by the late John Burdine to R. M. Fiekens, Henry W. Murff and Samuel Wyatt, Trustees for the Methodist Protestant Church, by deed bearing date May 19, 1897 and recorded on the day of its date in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyances for said State and County in Book "JJ" of Deeds, at page 504.

We further certify that a portion of the land so conveyed by said Burdine was set apart for use as a parsonage, and that the lot this day conveyed to said Hill is a portion of the said parsonage lot.

We further certify that the said J. R. Tripp, J. R. Watson, H. W. Murff and R. F. Wyatt are the duly elected successors of the trustees named by said Burdine in his deed to said church.

We further certify that the only portion of the constitution and discipline of the said Methodist Protestant Church regulating the selling conveying and mortgaging of parsonage property belonging to a circuit is section 9 of part 4th of said Constitution and Discipline, dealing with "Government of the Church", and that said section reads as follows;

"In every case where a parsonage belongs to a station or circuit, the Quarterly Conference shall have authority to elect, or cause to be elected, trustees thereof, in accordance with the statute laws of the State, to hold said property for the benefit of such charge. When parsonage property is to be purchased, leased, mortgaged or sold, it shall require a vote of two-thirds of the members of the Quarterly Conference, except where charters provide otherwise; Provided, that in stations it shall require the two-thirds vote of the qualified members of the church".

We further certify that said parsonage does not belong to a station, but belongs to the Anderson Circuit of the said church, which circuit is composed of the Fairview Church and the Liberty Hill Church.

We further certify that the regular second quarterly conference of the Anderson Circuit of the Methodist Protestant Church was duly held at Greenville, South Carolina, at the residence of Mr. J. Lee Pool, on the Twenty-ninth day of March, A. D. 1910; and that due and regular notice of the holding of such conference was given in accordance with the requirements of the Constitution and discipline of said church by announcing the same from the pulpits of the said Fairview and Liberty Hill Churches more than four weeks prior to the holding of said conference; that H. A. Foster was elected chairman of said conference and presided over the same; and that R. F. Wyatt acted as Secretary thereof; that there are only twenty (20) members of said conference, and that fifteen of said members attended said conference in person, being more than two-thirds thereof; that at said conference a resolution was unanimously adopted, authorizing the said parsonage trustees to sell the said parsonage in Greenville for the sum of Two Thousand, Eight Hundred and Twenty-five Dollars (\$2,825.00) and from the proceeds of sale to discharge the mortgage debt now resting upon said parsonage lot and to erect a new parsonage on the adjoining lot.

We further certify that the lot this day sold by said trustees to said Hill is the lot which the said trustees were authorized to sell under the resolution of the Quarterly Conference above referred to.
