) AFFIDAVIT OF R. W. (RANDY) GREGORY
 COUNTY OF GREENVILLE)

PERSONALLY APPEARED before me the undersigned, R. W. (Randy) Gregory, who, after being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

That he is the owner and operator of R. W. Gregory Gold and Silver located at 19 Trenholm Plaza, Columbia, South Carolina;

That during the latter part of December, 1980, he went on a buying trip to England; and he returned on the evening of January 3, 1981, which was a Saturday, to the Atlanta Airport. Upon arriving at the Atlanta Airport, he was met by his brother-in-law, James R. Roach, who informed him that Randy L. Pope and he had boxed up Forty-Five Thousand (\$45,000.00) Dollars worth of gold and diamonds and had brought them to the Atlanta Airport with the idea of having deponent determine what part of said merchandise he desired to sell to Mr. Pope; and that while Mr. Pope waited on the outside of the airport for Mr. Roach to go in and determine what flight R. W. Gregory would return on, and having so determined that, Mr. Roach went back outside and told Mr. Pope. Then Mr. Roach went back inside to see if he could locate deponent; and failing to locate deponent, Mr. Roach returned to the outside to find that Mr. Pope had left in his automobile taking with him the gold and diamonds valued at Forty-Five Thousand (\$45,000.00) Dollars and a 357 Astra Magnum, a leather coat, a calculator and Sixty-Five (\$65.00) Dollars in cash valued at Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars. Deponent further states that he and Mr. Roach then waited some three (3) hours at the same spot where Mr. Pope had left from and that he did not return. After that, they searched the Atlanta Airport; and not finding Mr. Pope, they telephoned long distance from Atlanta Mr. Pope's home at 10 Keowee Avenue, Greenville, South Carolina, and his four (4) places of business in Greenville and got no answer.
