TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY CONCERN:

I, W. H. Cunningham

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) SEND(S) GREETING:

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto FIDELITY FEDERAL SAVINGS AND LOAN ASSOCIATION, GREENVILLE, S. C., (hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) as evidenced by the Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference in the sum of Twenty-Five Hundred and No/100- - - -

DOLLARS (\$ 2500.00), with interest thereon from date at the rate of Six (6%) per centum per annum, said principal and interest to be repaid as therein stated, and

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the said Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to or for the Mortgagor's account for taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs, or for any other purpose:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns.

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Butler Township, on the North side of the Public Road leading from Leland Cunningham's home to Hudson Road at the late James Hudson's home, and situated near Rock Hill Baptist Church, adjoining lands of James Hudson, Estate, on the South, and other lands of P. D. Cunningham on the West, North and East, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

"BEGINNING at an iron pin near a pine on line of James Hudson's Estate, and running thence N. 3/4 E. 4.45 chains to an iron pin in a cleared field; thence S. 53-1/2 E. 2.00 chains to an iron pin in cluster of small oaks; thence S. 85-1/2 E. 1.33 chains to a point in center of the above mentioned Public Road; thence with said Road, S. 36 E. 1.92 chains to a point in center of Public Road; thence S. 57-1/4 W. 5.80 chains to the beginning corner, containing 1.88 acres, according to a survey made by J. Earle Freeman on April 16, 1937."

Said premises being the same conveyed to the mortgagor by P. D. Cunningham by deed dated April 16, 1937, recorded in Volume 193 at Page 364.

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the same belonging or in any way incident or appertaining, and all of the rents, issues, and profits which may arise or be had therefrom, and including all heating, plumbing, and lighting fixtures and any other equipment or fixtures now or hereafter attached, connected, or fitted thereto in any manner; it being the intention of the parties hereto that all such fixtures and equipment, other than the usual household furniture, be considered a part of the real estate.
