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TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY CONCERN:

We, George and Essie Scott,

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagor) SEND(S) GREETING:

WHEREAS, the Mortgagor is well and truly indebted unto Citizens Lumber Company

(hereinafter referred to as Mortgagee) as evidenced by the Mortgagor's promissory note of even date herewith, the terms of which are incorporated herein by reference, in the sum of Thirty-five Hundred and No/100 - -

DOLLARS (\$3500.00

with interest thereon from date at the rate of Six (6%) per centum per annum, said principal and interest to be repaid: PAYABLE: in monthly payments of \$35.00 each to begin on November 1, 1954, and a like amount to be paid on the first day of each month thereafter, to be applied first to interest and then to principal, until paid in full, with interest thereon from date at the rate of Six (6%) per cent. per annum, to be computed semi-annually and paid monthly.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagoe at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagoe pursuant to the covenants herein and also in consideration of the further sum of Three (\$3.00) Dollars to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagoe at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagoe, his heirs, successors and assigns:

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Gantt Township, about four miles from the Greenville Courthouse, on the Southern side of the Old Anderson Road, being a portion of Tract No. 13, as shown on Plat of property of P. S. Butler made by J. N. Southern on July 2, 1907, recorded in Plat Book A at Page 165, and described as follows:

"BEGINNING at a stake on the Southern side of the Old Anderson Road, at corner of property of Judge and Evelyn Penson, and running thence with the line of said lot, S. 36-20 E. 126 feet to a stake; thence continuing with the line of said property, S. 55-45 W. 75.6 feet to a stake in line of lot No. 14; thence with the line of said lot, S. 30-30 E. 580 feet, more or less, to a stake at corner of lot No. 11; thence with the line of said lot, N. 59-30 E. 231 feet to a stake, corner of lot No. 13, thence with the line of said lot, N. 30-30 W. 800 feet to a stake on the Old Anderson Road; thence with the Southern side of Old Anderson Road, S. 31-48 W. 194.4 feet to the beginning corner."

Being the same property conveyed to the mortgagors by deed recorded in Deed Book 41, at Page 150, less tracts recorded in Deed Book 201 at Page 154, and Deed book 354 at Page 251.

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Gantt Township, containing 1 acre, about 4 miles west of Greenville Courthouse and described as follows:

"BEGINNING at a point on Old location of Anderson Road, 525.5 feet in a south-westerly direction from an iron pin and stone pillar at intersection of old location and new location of said Anderson Road, new location being known as Highway 81, and running thence N. 47 W. 136 feet to a stake; thence S. 45 W. 704.5 feet to an iron pin at said old road location; thence with said road, N. 58-30 E. 473.9 feet to a stake; thence N. 64 E. 230.6 feet to the beginning corner."

Being the same premises conveyed to George Samuel Scott by deed recorded in Volume 307 at Page 312, and to George S. Scott and Essie Scott by deed recorded in Volume 5 at Page 251.
