

Office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County, S. C., in Deed Book 260, Page 295. Forty-one (41) acres of the original 65 acre tract having been conveyed by deed of Grantor to Kelliee which is of record in said R.M.C. Office, leaving a balance of 24 acres, more or less, being conveyed by this deed.

Reference to the aforementioned deeds and to a Plat prepared by W. M. Nash, Reg. Surveyor and Engineer on January 28, 1944 is made for a more complete description.

This being the same property conveyed to David J. Vaughn by H. E. Coggins by his deed dated August 4, 1955, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 531, at page 328.

BEGINNING at a point, lightwood stump o, Thompson corner, and running thence N. 45 E. 8.75 chains along Thompson line to point, dead pine o; thence continuing with Thompson line, N. 20 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 39.50 chains to point in center of Reedy River, stone o, pointers on bank of River; thence in an easterly direction along center of Reedy River as the line, 30.80 chains to point; stone on bank of River, corner of the Walter Thompson lands; thence S. 14 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 44.00 chains along line of the Walter Thompson lands to stone o, the D. J. Vaughn corner; thence with the Vaughn line, S. 35 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 7.50 chains to point, stone n; thence N. 62 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 8.15 chains to the beginning corner; containing 76 $\frac{1}{2}$  acres, more or less.

Office for Greenville County; and it is the same property conveyed to the said Hamp (or H.) Sims by W. D. Ridgeway by deed dated Nov. 24, 1919, recorded in Vol. 71 at page 502 in said R.M.C. Office.
