in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof, according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars, to me in hand well and truly paid at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said

Melvin K. Younts and Charles W. Spence, their heirs and assigns forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land containing 40-1/2 acres, mare or less, situate on Horse Creek and the Dunklin Bridge Road, and being more particularly described according to a plat of the property of William M. McDougle prepared by W.F.Lee, August 22, 1904, and recorded in Plat Book A at Page 431, as follows:

Beginning at a stake in the Dunklin Bridge Road on line of lands now or formerly of T. C.Chapman and running thence S 52-3/4 W, 19.57 chains to an iron pin on stake in the center of Horse Creek; thence with the meanders of Horse Creek as a line in a southeasterly direction 20.60 chains to a sweet gum; thence N 56 E, 20.40 chains to a stake in the Dunklin Bridge Road; thence with said road, N 47-3/4 W, 11.50 chains to a stake; thence continuing along said road, N 36-1/2 W, 10.18 chains to the point of beginning.
