WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the said Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced to or for the Mortgagor's account for taxes, insurance premiums, public assessments, repairs, or for any other purpose:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the payment thereof and of any other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagee at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagee, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagee at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagee, its successors and assigns.

"All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or hereafter constructed thereon, situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, in Greenville Township, being known and designated as Lot #9 on a plat of the property of Virginia C. Summey, which is recorded in Plat Book "JJ" at page 90 in the RMC office for Greenville County, and having according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southern side of a street now known as Paladin Street (designated on the above plat as an alley) at the joint front corner of Lots 9 and 10 and running thence with the line of Lot 10, S. 34-03 E. 99.8 feet, more or less to an iron pin; thence N. 56-14 E. 65.4 feet to an iron pin on Von Holland (formerly King Street); thence with said Von Holland Street, N. 39-21 W. 100 feet, more or less, to an iron pin on Paladin Street; thence with said Paladin Street 55 feet to the beginning corner.

And being a portion of the property conveyed to me by my husband, James Carl Summey, dated April 25, 1956 and recorded in the RMC office for Greenville County.

The above mentioned plat is a revision of Lots 9, 10, 15 and 16 of property of Ethel Y. Perry Estate.

Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the same belonging or in any way incident or appertaining, and all of the rents, issues, and profits which may arise or be had therefrom, and including all heating, plumbing, and lighting fixtures and any other equipment or fixtures now or hereafter attached, connected, or fitted thereto in any manner; it being the intention of the parties hereto that all such fixtures and equipment, other than the usual household furniture, be considered a part of the real estate.
