WILLIAM H. RICHARDSON and ANDREW J. WHITE

 (herein called mortgagor) SEND GREETING:
 WHEREAS, the said mortgagor WILLIAM H. RICHARDSON and ANDREW J. WHITE

in and by a certain promissory note in writing, of even date with these Presents is well and truly indebted to the LIBERTY LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, a corporation chartered under the laws of the State of South Carolina, in the full and just sum of Thirty Thousand and No/100 -----
 (\$ 30,000.00) DOLLARS, to be paid at its Home Office in Greenville, S. C., together with interest thereon from date hereof until maturity at the rate of five ----- (5 %) per centum per annum, said principal and interest being payable in monthly ----- instalments as follows:
 Beginning on the 1st day of October -----, 1956, and on the 1st day of month ----- of each year thereafter the sum of \$318.30 -----, to be applied on the interest and principal of said note, said payments to continue up to and including the 1st day of August -----, 1966, and the balance of said principal and interest to be due and payable on the 1st day of September -----, 1966; the aforesaid monthly ----- payments of \$318.30 ----- each are to be applied first to interest at the rate of five ----- (5 %) per centum per annum on the principal sum of \$30,000.00 ----- or so much thereof as shall, from time to time, remain unpaid and the balance of each monthly ----- payment shall be applied on account of principal.

All instalments of principal and all interest are payable in lawful money of the United States of America; and in the event default is made in the payment of any instalment or instalments, or any part thereof, as therein provided, the same shall bear simple interest from the date of such default until paid at the rate of seven (7%) per centum per annum.

And if at any time any portion of principal or interest shall be past due and unpaid, or if default be made in respect to any condition, agreement or covenant contained herein, then the whole sum of the principal of said note remaining at that time unpaid together with the accrued interest, shall become immediately due and payable, at the option of the holder thereof, who may sue thereon and foreclose this mortgage; and if said note, after its maturity, should be placed in the hands of an attorney for suit or collection, or if, before its maturity, it should be deemed by the holder thereof necessary for the protection of its interests to place, and the holder should place, the said note and mortgage in the hands of an attorney for any legal proceedings; then and in either of such cases the mortgagor promises to pay all costs and expenses including a reasonable attorney's fee, these to be added to the mortgage indebtedness, and to be secured under this mortgage as a part of said debt.

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN, That the said mortgagor, in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid, and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said LIBERTY LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY according to the terms of the said note, and also in consideration of the further sum of THREE DOLLARS, to the said mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the said LIBERTY LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY, at and before the signing of these Presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said LIBERTY LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY

ALL that lot of land with the buildings and improvements thereon, situate on the Northeast side of Washington Avenue, near the City of Greenville, in Greenville County, S. C., being shown as a portion of Westview on a plat made by C. M. Furman, Jr., Engineer, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. in Plat Book "F", page 139 and 140 and having, according to a survey made by R. W. Dalton, Engineer, August 16, 1956, the following metes and bounds, to wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the Northeast side of Washington Avenue, said pin being 125.6 feet in a Southeasterly direction from the point where the Northeast side of Washington Avenue intersects with the Southeast side of Valley Street, and running thence N. 44-16 E. 225 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 46-34 E. 235 feet to an iron pin; thence S. 44-16 W. 309 feet to an iron pin on the Northeast side of Washington Avenue; thence with the Northeast side of Washington Avenue N. 26-50 W. 248.5 feet to the beginning corner.

ALSO all our right, title and interest in and to an easement for the purpose of maintaining and keeping in good order and repair that sewer line extending from the Northeast corner of the above described property over and through a portion of Lots 122 and 123 of Westview Heights to the sewer main in Wilburn Street, which easements were conveyed to the Mortgagors herein by deed of Claude D. Lindsey and Ruby K. Burris, dated May 17 and May 18, 1956, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 554, page 147 and Deed Book 554, page 148.
