G. Glenn property made by C. M. Furman, Engr. on March 28, 1923 and recorded in Plat Book F, at page 148, RMC Office for Greenville County and according to the plat of the property of William Samuel Langley made by Pickell & Pickell, Engrs., July 3, 1946, described as follows:
