DEBTOR REPRESENTS, WARRANTS AND AGREES AS FOLLOWS:

The Collateral has been acquired and is used by the Debtor (or will be acquired and will be used) primarily for the purpose checked below:

- A. Equipment used in business or profession (other than farming).
- B. Fixtures to be attached to real estate located in County of Greenville, State of South Carolina and described as follows:
