And it is the purpose and intent if this instrument that, aming other things, at all times when the title is held to the Government, or in the event the Government should assign this instrument without insurance of the note, this instrument shall secure payment of the note, but when the note is held by an insured holder, this instrument shall not secure payment of the note or attach to the debt evidenced thereby, but as to the note and such debt shall constitute an indemnity mortgage to secure the Government against loss under its insurance contract by reason of any default by Burrower
