WHEREAS, the Mortgagor may hereafter become indebted to the said Mortgagee for such further sums as may be advanced or readvanced to or for the Mortgagee's account, including advances made by the Mortgagee on other or no security:

NOW, KNOW ALL MEN. That the Mortgagor, in consideration of the aforesaid debt, and in order to secure the partition and characteristic states that there is an other and further sums for which the Mortgagor may be indebted to the Mortgagor at any time for advances made to or for his account by the Mortgagor, and also in consideration of the further sum of Three D dark (\$3.00) to the Mortgagor in hand well and truly paid by the Mortgagor at and before the scaling and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargainal orbit and released, and by these presents does grant, bargain, sell and release unto the Mortgagor, its occursors and assigns.

Till that certain piece, parcel or lot of land, with all improvements thereon, or bereafter constructed thereon, of the land in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville. On the northern side of Leyswood Drive, near the City of Greenville, being shown as Lot 94A on plat of Section III, Wade Hampton Gardens, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina, in Plat Book YY at Page 179 and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the northern side of Leyswood Drive at the corner of Lot 94 and running thence with the northern side of said drive S. 74-33 W. 100 feet; thence S. 86-42 W. 78.5 feet to an iron pin at the corner of Lot 66; thence with line of said lot, N. 27-03 E. 123.2 feet to an iron pin at the corner of Lot No. 67; thence with line of said lot, N. 62-24 E. 89.1 feet to an iron pin in the line of Lot 94; thence with line of said lot, S. 18-17 E. 126 feet to the point of beginning.

In addition to and together with the monthly payments of principal and interest under the terms of the note secured hereby, the mortgagor promises to pay to the mortgagee for the term of the guaranty policy the sum of 1/48th of 1% of the original amount of this loan in payment of the mortgage guaranty insurance covering this loan and on his failure to pay it, the mortgagee may advance it for the mortgagor's amount and collect it as part of the debt secured by the mortgage.

The mortgagors agree to maintain guaranty insurance in force until the loan balance reaches 75% or less of the original appraisal or sales price, whichever is less, and the mortgage may apply for mortgage guaranty insurance to comply with the above, through the mortgage guaranty insurance company insuring this loan, and that the mortgagor agrees to pay to the mortgagee, annually, as premium for such insurance 1/4 of 1% of the principal balance then existing.



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Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the same belonging or in any way incident or appertaining, and all of the rents, issues, and profits which may arise or be had therefrom, and including all heating, plumbing, and lighting fixtures and any other equipment or fixtures now or hereafter attached, connected, or fitted thereto in any manner; it being the intention of the parties hereto that all such fixtures and equipment, other than the usual household furniture, he considered a part of the real estate.

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
