In the matter of the claim of } E. H. Ross, Tigorville, S. C. | REPORT.

This is a claim for damages in the amount of \$200.00, alloged to have been sustained on account of damage to ground and timber on a tract of 22 acres of land, of which claiment is the owner, bounded on the North by the land of D. H. Bates, which was leased to the Government, on the East by lands of S. L. Barton and H. R. Turner, which were Isssed, and on the South by land of S. L. Barton.

This elaim was considered by a Board of Officers, convened pursuant to paragraph 9, Special Orders No. 22, Headquarters, Camp Wadsworth, 8. C., dated January 22nd, 1919,

Claimant was duly awarn and the Board exemined his land and escertained that it consists of 10 agree of timber and 12 sores of bottom land. Claimant swore that his land was not leased to the Government, and that no effort was made by the the Government to lease it; that the Infantry Camp was located on the Sarmer land on the Artillery and Rifle Range, Gamp Wadsworth, S. C., which land adjoined him on the North and West; that the Infantry soldiers out a large amount of timber on his land; that they established tents and a part of their camp site thereon; that they tramped over 12 acres of bottom land and established swimming holes in the creek on his land; that he had a crop on the land in 1918 and that troops tramped over the land so that he was unable to tend his crop or gather came; and that his 1918 crop was an entire loss.

From & physical examination of the land the Local Board found that there is still evidence on his land of a comp having been established thereon; that approximately 25 cords of timber had been out from his land, valued still.50, this being the rate for wood on the stump, provided by the terms of leases on surrounding treats. This amount was arrived at by examination of stumps and counting the stumps of trees that had been out down by persons unaccustomed to that character of work. The Board found several readways made through the bottom land to the creek, and

from the testimony of the claiment and of neighbors, it appears that most of the personnel of the comp crossed this land each evening for the purpose of swimming. The Local Board in view of the above evidence concluded that the land of claiment received as such use as did the surrounding lassed land, and the Board was of the opinion that claiment was entitled to companeation in the form of rent for his 22 cores at the same rate as paid to surrounding land owners: that is, \$3.00 per sere per summ, or 565.00. The writer bolieves that this is a fair edjustment for the use of this land for the recom that evidence substitled in over a hundred cuses of claims by land owners on the target range, Camp Vadeworth, show that this land was leaded beginning November 27th, 1917: that it was used strat by the 27th pivision and later by the 6th Division; that the troops moved on the land before the lesse began to runs and that the land was used as a target runge from that time until acce time in the summer of 1918, which would proclude the pleating of crops for that year.

The Local Board estimated damages on account of rocdways at \$16.00, this being at the rate of extra plowing on 6 acros of bottos land.

The Local Board recommended reinbursement in the amount of \$96.50 in settlement of this claim.

Claiment has agreed to eccept this amount in full and complete notisfaction of decapes to his land by reason of occupancy or of any other act of the deverment.

In view of the above facts, I recommend that an award leave in favor of T. H. Hoss, in the sum of \$96.50, in full and complete entisfection of his claim.
