the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said C. W. Eskew, all that lot or parcel of land containing thirty-nine hundredths (39-100) of an acre, more or less, situate in Grove Township, County and State aforesaid, near the town of Piedmont, bounded by lands of the estate of Henry Bantt, C. W. Eskew and lots nos. 1 and 3, and known as lot no. 2, in the division of the lands of M. J. Trammell, deceased, and having the following metes and bounds, to wit; beginning on an iron pin on corner of lot no. 1; thence N. 12 1/4 E. 3.11 to iron pin; thence N. 77 1/4 W. 1.26 to iron pin; thence S. 12 1/4 W. 3.11 to iron pin; thence S. 77 1/4 E. 1.26 to the beginning corner.
