the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Emanuel Morris, the following described real estate:

"All that certain piece, parcel and lot of land situated, lying and being in Butler Township, County and State aforesaid, and known as Lots Nos. 3 and 4 of the L.B. Smith place, containing forty-seven (47) acres, more or less, and adjoining lands of Mrs. C. Smith, Mrs. W. Green, H. Smith, The Peoples Bank of Greenville, S.C., and Sloan L. Stroud, and being the same land conveyed to Charlie Morris by the Peoples Bank of Greenville, S.C., by deed dated March 15, 1905."

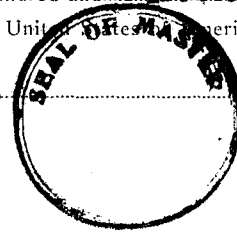
