CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

WHEREAS, Fessie S. Carter and E. M. Blythe, of Greenville, S.C.

two or more of the officers or agents appointed to supervise or manage the affairs of Greenville Public Library Association

which has been duly and regularly organized, did on the 6th day of May, A. D. 1921, file with the Secretary of State a written declaration setting forth:

That at a meeting of the aforesaid organization held pursuant to the by-laws or regulations of the said organization, they were authorized and directed to apply for incorporation.

That the said organization holds, or desires to hold, property in common for a Religious, Educational, Social, Fraternal, Charitable or other eleemosynary purpose, or any two or more of said purposes, and is not organized for the purpose of profit or gain to the members, otherwise than is above stated, or for the insurance of life, health, accident or property; and that three days' notice in the Greenville Daily News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville, has been given that the aforesaid Declaration would be filed.

AND WHEREAS, That said Declarants and Petitioners further declared and affirmed:

FIRST. Their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND. The name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Public Library Association

THIRD. The place at which it proposes to have its headquarters or be located is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH. The purpose of the said proposed Corporation is the establishment and maintenance of an adequate free public library in Greenville, South Carolina, and the promotion of the "modern library movement" in the City and County of Greenville.
