WHEREAS, T.C. Gower, W.D. Parrish, N.C. Poe, Jr. and W.P. Conyers

did on the 21st, day of September, 1922, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is The Laurens Road Water Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is 125 W. McBea Ave., Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is To construct, own and operate a water pipe line along the Laurens Road from the City limits of Greenville, S.C., to sell the right to tap said water pipe, to construct, own and operate and sell rights to tap other pipe lines along other roads and to do construction work.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Six thousand (\$6,000.00) Dollars, payable

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Sixty (60) of the par value of One hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 18th, day of September, 1922 at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: N.C. Poe, Jr., T.C. Gower, W.D. Parrish and W.P. Conyers.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President W.D. Parrish as Vice-President, T.C. Gower as Treasurer, T.C. Gower as Secretary, and

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1912, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Daily Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. Banks Dove, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
