described real estate; All that piece parcel or lot of land
in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina
and being known and designated as lot no. 5 according
to a plat of property of the said M. W. Jones and
Crystal Alton Williams, made April 1922 by C. P. Dutton
E. C., said lot being described as follows: Beginning
beginning at a stake on the north side of Crystal Creek
and running thence along joint line of lots 4 and 5 to
a stone joint corner of lots 4 and 5 thence along joint
