WHEREAS, J. C. Phillips and Ennis Smith, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 14th day of January, 1925, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is

United Tire Company

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, sell, exchange or otherwise deal in automobile tires or tires of other motor vehicles and motor vehicle accessories of all kinds to repair automobiles and trucks to operate a garage, and to do any and all such other things incident thereto.

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President, J. C. Phillips, as Vice-President, Ennis Smith, as Treasurer, J. C. Phillips, and as Secretary, Ennis Smith.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 2, Article 1, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1912, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville Daily News newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
