

THE STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA, BY THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT WHEREAS, E. C. Nelson, E. C. Nelson, Jr., and J. M. Zachary,

did on the 1st day of January, 1925, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Mutual Insurance Agency of South Carolina

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to conduct an agency for the solicitation and writing of all kinds of insurance and to buy, sell and deal in real estate and stocks and bonds, and to do each and everything or act necessary, proper or incident to the accomplishment of such purposes as which should be conducive to be expedient for the protection and benefit of such corporations.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 26th day of January, 1925, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: E. C. Nelson, E. C. Nelson, Jr., and J. M. Zachary

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President, E. C. Nelson, Jr.; as Vice-President, E. C. Nelson; as Treasurer, J. M. Zachary; as Secretary, E. C. Nelson, Jr.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville. NOW, THEREFORE, I, N. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT WHEREAS, Claude Ramsaur and J. R. McDonald, both of Greenville, S.C.
