EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, Chas. B. Macgowan and B. Marsalis, both of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 12th day of May, 1927, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Carolina Jitney-Jungle Co
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is To buy, sell and deal in and with staple and fancy groceries, grain and feed stuff either at wholesale or retail or both, and to manufacture and prepare for market and sale the above said articles and all other articles necessary or convenient for use in carrying on said business or any part thereof; to buy, sell, own, hold, trade, lease or develop real estate and to do any and all things incident thereto; to receive and hold on storage food products and other commodities and to issue receipts therefor; and to borrow or lend money and execute notes and mortgages or other evidences of indebtedness together with the general powers of a Corporation as provided for under the laws of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty Thousand, (\$20,000.00) Dollars, payable in money or property

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Hundred (200) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 11th day of May, 1927, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: W. B. Moore, B. Marsalis and Chas. B. Macgowan.

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President W. B. Moore as Vice-President B. Marsalis; as Secretary, Chas. B. Macgowan as Treasurer, Chas. B. Macgowan, as manager, B. Marsalis.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 22, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922, 1922, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Piedmont, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, H. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

did on the 9th day of May, 1927, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Lakeside Amusement Corporation
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to build, buy, lease or otherwise acquire, own, operate, maintain, sell or rent, merry-go-rounds, ferris wheels, shooting galleries and any and all other devices calculated to offer amusement to the public and profit to the company. To carry on the business of and to do any and all things that may be generally connected with an amusement company. To erect, maintain and operate bathing, fishing, boating and swimming establishments. To carry on the business of buying and selling cigars, cigarettes, all other forms of tobacco, and to carry on a general restaurant and grocery business. Also to operate any other kind of park or resort development.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Five Thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars, payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Fifty (50) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 29th day of April, 1927, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: H. D. Harkness and H. H. Cates.

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President H. D. Harkness as Vice-President H. H. Cates; as Secretary, H. H. Cates as Treasurer, H. D. Harkness.
