WHEREAS, Lewis W. Parker, E. Earle Stone and R. G. Stone, Jr. all of Greenville, S.C.

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Eagle Air Ways, Inc.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is Commercial Air Flying.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLVIII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Piedmont newspaper published in the County of Greenville.
