WHEREAS, Claude E. Hood and John A. Hood, of Green, S.C., and Spartanburg S.C. respectively

did on the 26th day of March, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

- FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.
SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Green Marble and Granite Company
THIRD: That the principal place of business is Green, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is the buying and selling of marble and granite for the purpose of erecting monuments and other commercial purposes.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 25th day of March, 1929,

at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Claude E. Hood, John A. Hood and Jesse L. Hood

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President Claude E. Hood as Vice-President Jesse L. Hood as Secretary John A. Hood as Treasurer Claude E. Hood

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 21, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Green Citizen newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W.P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Means Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
