WHEREAS, M. A. Shealy and H. H. Bradford, both of Greenville, S.C.

did on the 1st day of March, 1929, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Basketeria Market Company.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S.C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy and sell meats, dairy products, sea food and any other goods, wares and merchandise whatsoever, at whole sale or retail, or both; to establish and operate refrigerating plants, and cold storage and other work houses; to manufacture sausage and other meat products, as well as articles of any other character; to purchase and whenever acquire, retire, cancel, redeem and re issue its own stock, so far as may be permitted by law; and to do each and everything necessary, convenient, suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes herein enumerated, or which shall at any time appear conducive to, or expedient for the protection or benefit of this corporation

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Seven Thousand (\$7000.00) Dollars,

payable in money, property or labor

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Seventy (70) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 25th day of February, 1929, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

M. A. Shealy and H. H. Bradford

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President M. A. Shealy as Vice-President, H. H. Bradford as Secretary, H. H. Bradford as Treasurer, M. A. Shealy

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XLIII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, H. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Means Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
