EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, W. J. Strauss, W. B. Sumner and S. M. Boynton, all of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 14th day of March, 1930, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Quality Service Stores of Greenville

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to purchase and distribute advertising matter and materials, and to do collective advertising for the members and stockholders of this Corporation, and to exercise the general powers conferred upon business corporations under the laws of South Carolina.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is One Thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars,

payable in cash

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred (100) of the par value of Ten (10) Dollars

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 11th day of February, 1930, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors:

W. J. Strauss, W. B. Sumner, S. M. Boynton, J. A. Zigler and W. S. Drake.

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President W. J. Strauss as Vice-President, W. B. Sumner; as Secretary, J. A. Zigler as Treasurer, W. S. Drake.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXVII, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.

did on the 31st day of March, 1930, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is GREENVILLE EXHIBITION ASSOCIATION

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to operate a base ball club in the South Atlantic League, and to do any and all things incident to the proper management and maintenance of such a business.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter XXXIX, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in Greenville Daily News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville
