EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, Mary E. R. Eskew and G. Frank Robinson,

did on the 1st day of June, 1921, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Peoples Loan Co., Inc.,

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, lease or otherwise acquire lands, and erect buildings of any kind thereon, to be used for any purpose, with power to retransfer same by making good, fee simple title, or to lease same; to conduct a general brokerage or commission business, including the buying, selling or renting of real estate, or the selling of merchandise upon commission; to conduct a general loan business, lending money in any amounts, secured by mortgage on real or personal property; to act as agent for life or fire insurance companies, and conduct a mercantile business of any kind. SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Ten Shares (10) of the par value of one Hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 28th day of May, 1921, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Mary E. R. Eskew and G. Frank Robinson

EIGHT: That subsequently there was elected as President, Mary E. R. Eskew, as Vice-President, G. Frank Robinson, as Secretary, Mary E. R. Eskew, as Treasurer, Mary E. R. Eskew.

NINTH: That all requirements of Chapter 2222, Article I, of the Civil Code of South Carolina, 1922 and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Piedmont, a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, W. P. Blackwell, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Meane Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
