KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That We, Gordon A. Gaston and Wilton G. Holland,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One dollar and love and affection

us Addie Lee Gaston, in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have Granted, Bargained, Sold, and Released, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell and Release unto the said

Addie Lee Gaston,

"All our right, title and interest in and to that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate on the north side of East Stone Avenue, between main and Elizabeth streets, and known as Lot No. 6 on a plat made by J. W. Southern, and recorded in Vol. VV, page 544, in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, said map being a subdivision of a map made the 10th day of January, 1890 and represented on a map of this same record in the same volume and on the same page as above set out, and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

"Beginning at an iron pin on the north side of East Stone Avenue 272 feet and 4 inches east of Main street; thence with Stone avenue, S. 73 E. 54 feet 6 inches to an iron pin; corner Lot 7; thence with line of Lot 7, N. 17 E. 206 feet and 6 inches to iron pin; thence N. 73 W. 54 feet 6 inches to an iron pin; thence with line of Lot 5, S. 17 W. 206 feet 6 inches to the beginning corner."

It is the intention and purpose of this deed to convey all our right title and interest in and to the above described lot, the same being an undivided one-half interest each, unto the said Addie Lee Gaston, for and during her natural life, to be used as a home by her, and upon her death to revert to the grantors herein, the said Addie Lee Gaston being the owner of the other undivided one-third interest in and to said lot, being the same property inherited by us as heirs at law of A. J. Gaston, deceased.
