C. Dalton, Engineer:*

*Beginning at a point on the north side of Webster Street, adjoining other property of the grantor, and running thence north 30.12 E. 117 feet more or less, thence N. 67.30 W. 44 feet, thence South 20.12 West through an outhouse 119 feet to Webster Street, thence with Webster Street South 69.48 E. 44 feet to the point of beginning.*
