All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Fairview Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Fairview Township County and State aforesaid, and bounded as follows:- On the north by lands of Miss Lizzie Peden, on the east and south by lands of Lucian Gray, on the west by lands of J. E. Tollison, being located about one mile east of Hillside Baptist Church and meets and bounds as follows:-

Beginning at a stone in public road corner of Gray's land and running thence N. 23 1/2 E. 26.26 chains to a stone on Lee Meares' line; thence with Meares' line N. 64 1/2 W. 12.08 to a stone, Miss Peden's corner; thence N. 86 1/2 W. 15.00 to a stone; thence S. 3 1/2 W. 17.40 to a stake in the above named public road; thence with road S. 75 E. 4.50 to bend; thence S. 86 1/2 E. 4.50 to second bend; thence S. 33 1/2 E. 6.50 to a third bend; thence S. 86 1/2 E. 6.44 to the beginning corner, containing 47.33 acres, more or less, and being the same tract of land conveyed to the above named Jim (J.
