WHEREAS, W. T. Henderson, C. B. Martin, N. O. McDowell,  
J. P. Moore, and O. P. Moore, of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 8th day of January, 1940, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is Greenville Land and Auction Company, Inc.,

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is selling, buying, trading, leasing, and developing real estate; acting as agents for individuals and corporations; contracting to build dwellings or buildings of any other nature and contracting to do anything incident to the general real estate business; transacting and conducting any similar business pertaining to any of the above named transactions, and to do any and all other things necessary and incident to the proper management and maintenance of said business.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000.00)

payable in cash or its equivalent at the direction of the Directors of said corporation

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is two hundred and fifty (250) of the par value of One hundred (\$100.00)

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 5th day of January, 1940, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: W. T. Henderson, C. B. Martin, N. O. McDowell, J. P. Moore, and O. P. Moore.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President W. T. Henderson as Vice-President, J. P. Moore; as Secretary, N. O. McDowell as Treasurer, C. B. Martin; Asst. Secretary & Treasurer, O. P. Moore.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News.

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
