WHEREAS, Augustus W. Smith, Belle P. Smith, and Floride S. McBee, of Greenville, S. C.

did on the 23rd day of May, 1940, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed Corporation is BEFAMP, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is to buy, sell, own, lease, rent, and operate, both city and farm property, of every nature and description; to buy, sell and own mortgages, stocks, bonds, and other forms of securities; and to do all things incident to and appertaining to the buying, selling, owning and operating real estate of every nature and description.

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FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Twelve Thousand (\$12,000.00) Dollars, payable on call.

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is one hundred and twenty (120) of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 22nd day of May, 1940, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy the following were elected directors: Belle P. Smith; Floride S. McBee, Augustus W. Smith, Mary Noble Smith and L. Perrin Smith.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President Belle P. Smith as Vice-President, Floride S. McBee; as Secretary, Augustus W. Smith as Treasurer, Augustus W. Smith.

NINTH: That all requirements of Article 2, Chapter 153 Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1932, and all amendments thereto, have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent, of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in The Greenville News a newspaper published in the County of Greenville.

NOW, Therefore, I, W. P. BLACKWELL, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
