their Heirs and assigns:

A certain piece, parcel of land situated, lying and being in County and State afore-  
said, on branch waters of Brushy Fork.

Beginning on a poplar 3x; thence N. W. to a spanish oak, 3x; thence nearly W. to a  
chestnut 3x; thence North to a chestnut oak 3x; thence nearly West to a chestnut oak 3x near the  
creek; thence West to a chestnut 3x; thence with Daniel Balew line to the branch; thence down said  
branch to a said flat rock on North side of the branch; thence with James Howard's line to the
