All that piece, parcel or lot of land in _____ Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina.
on head waters of Beaver Dam Waters of Middle Tiger River, lying mostly on East side of Greenville Road beginning on the Greenville Road J. P. Moons corner and running to a white oak near Andrew Sudduth's house with J. P. Moons line to Moons corner; thence about Northeast course to a stone L. D. McMakins and Andrew Sudduth's corner; thence with L. D. McMakins line to B. J. Stewart line; thence with Stewarts line to a large oak near the Greenville Road; thence with Behema Bonham's line to the beginning, containing one hundred acres, more or less.

Being the same tract of land conveyed to Sarah Sudduth and Peter C. Sudduth by Andrew Sudduth by deed dated November 9, 1885, and recorded in Vol. RR, page 209, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County.
