Whereas, my husband, R. F. Brashier, and I have separated and agreed to live separate and apart and we have agreed on a property settlement, and I have and do agree to release my said husband from all my property rights and claims of support of every kind; now, therefore, in consideration of the facts and circumstances hereinabove referred to, do hereby accept in full settlement of all my property rights in property owned by him, or jointly between myself and my said husband, the sum of Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, Four Hundred Twenty-five (\$425.00) Dollars of said sum being in cash and Seventy-five (\$75.00) Dollars in United States War Bonds, said bonds being made payable to me and my said husband jointly. This release includes all property, including household goods or otherwise of which I have, or may claim any interest in, owned either by myself or jointly with my said husband. This agreement is also to include any claim which I might have to any property, real or personal, owned solely by my said husband.
